Organizational Setting

The Regional Office for RNE is responsible for leading FAO's response to regional priorities for food security, agriculture and rural development through the identification, planning and implementation of FAO's priority activities in the region. It ensures a multidisciplinary approach to programmes, identifies priority areas of action for the Organization in the Region and, in collaboration with departments and divisions at Headquarters, develops, promotes and oversees FAO's strategic response to regional priorities. RNE also advises on the incorporation of regional priorities into the Organization's Programme of Work and Budget and implements approved programmes and projects in the region, monitors the level of programme implementation and draws attention to problems and deficiencies. RNE develops and maintains relations with region-wide institutions including the Regional Economic Integration Organizations (REIOs). The Regional Office supports regional policy dialogue on food security, agriculture and rural development issues, facilitates the emergence of regional partnerships, and supports capacity development and resource mobilization for food security, agriculture and rural development in the region.

Reporting Lines

The Senior Policy Officer reports to the Assistant Director General, Regional Representative, RNE and maintains regular contact with FAO headquarters in Rome for functional guidance on matters relating to policy and governance support in the food and agricultural sectors.

Technical Focus

Provides leadership, guidance and operational support for results-based policy assistance and governance work of decentralized offices in the Region, in relation to regional and sub-regional policy issues, and provides guidance to the work of policy officers posted at the regional, sub-regional and country levels in relation to their work on food security, nutrition and sustainable agricultural development.

Key Results

Development and implementation of coherent, integrated and effective policy assistance and governance work supporting member states at regional and country level: i) in accordance with the FAO Strategic Framework and its delivery mechanisms, and ii) in response to new policy assistance requests.

Key Functions

- Manages or leads highly specialized or multi-disciplinary teams, and provides technical leadership in high-level policy analysis missions or projects, policy networks and/or international policy setting bodies;
- Leads the work carried out by technical or policy officers from HQ or out-posted staff in the Decentralized Offices in relation to policy analysis and governance work under FAO's strategic framework;
- Advocates strategic partnerships, best practices, and policy dialogue in support of enhanced policies and governance for food and nutrition security, sustainable agriculture and food systems;
- Interacts with UN Regional and Country teams to improve cross-sectoral policies and strategies concerning food and nutrition security, sustainable agriculture and food systems and rural transformation;
- Analyzes regional and country-level issues to provide input into the identification of country and regional priorities and

requirements;

- Designs, implements and monitors regional and sub-regional policy work programmes and the supporting budgets and/or resourcing strategies;
- Plans, organizes and participates in capacity development activities involving the provision of technical advice and assistance, and oversees the development of related materials, on-line tools and information kits;
- Represents the Organization at international/inter-governmental meetings and conferences

Specific Functions

- Supports the improvement of the policy scope, relevance and effectiveness of Country Programming Frameworks towards achieving FAO's global goals and their implementation through FAO's Strategic Programmes;
- Develops effective working relationships and negotiates partnerships with international and national governmental and non-governmental partners, with a view to contributing to an enhanced governance of food and nutrition security, sustainable agriculture and food systems;
- Promotes the implementation and monitoring at regional and country levels of the Agenda 2030 Sustainable Development Goals in interaction with relevant partners;
- Advises member countries and regional economic organizations in the region in the analysis and formulation of policies, strategies and programmes for sustainable agriculture, rural development and transformation and food security, as well as regional policies, strategies and programmes aimed at enhanced cooperation and integration in the agricultural sector;
- Monitors key developments in the region, prepares regional economic and agricultural sector profiles, oversees up-todate information for use in country briefs and analytical work;
- Facilitates institutional and analytical capacity building in policy analysis, formulation and implementation;
- Leads policy reviews of the food and agricultural sectors at regional and country level, and supports monitoring and reporting on policies, action plans, initiatives and investments;
- Supports multi-disciplinary project development and implementation related to governance of food and nutrition security, sustainable agriculture and food systems at regional, sub-regional and country levels.

Minimum Requirements

- Advanced university degree in development economics, political sciences or agricultural economics or related field;
- Ten years of experience in policy advice and written policy analysis relating to food and nutrition security, agriculture and rural development, monitoring and evaluation of policies and programmes;
- Working knowledge of English, French or Spanish and limited knowledge of one of the other two or Russian, Arabic or Chinese
